Ceramics Syllabus 2

Ceramics is a year-long visual arts course which focuses on 3D art foundations and concepts. Students will have a practical experience in the creation of artwork using a variety of hand-building and wheel throwing techniques using clay.

The emphasis is on:

- exploration multiple ceramic construction and glazing techniques
- study the significance and use of ceramic by many cultures throughout history
- the process & importance of human expression and art-making.
- the development of creativity and artistic "voice"

General Expectations

- Please be on time. This means be in your seat and ready to go when the bell rings. The majority of the work for this course will be done during class, so you need to be here and be on time. We will use the entire class time either learning working on art or cleaning.
- Lets exercise respect in the classroom at all times. This means respect of other each other (you, me and fellow students), the materials/supplies and the classroom. Lets pay attention during instruction and when others students are talking. Consequences for being disruptive or destructive will be discussed on an individual basis, but would include additional cleanup, detention, referral, parent contact and/or lowering of studio performance grade.
- New art department policy: all phones will be placed in the lock box during class instruction and work time. This give students the opportunity to focus on their work undistracted.

Attendance And Tardy Police

Tardy Policy: Tardies 1 through 3, you will be marked tardy. On your fourth tardy, you will be assigned to jobs in the studio and/or detention. If tardies are excessive, I will discuss additional make-up time on an individual basis and lower studio performance grade.

As a working artist, you will help in the upkeep and maintenance of the studio. Jobs will be assigned on a rotating basis. Failure to do your jobs will have a negative impact on this grade. Unexcused absences will also affect this grade.

Classroom Materials & Supplies

Students should bring a pencil and sketchbook (unlined) daily. All clay and supplies for projects will be provided for projects in class, however students who use excess clay or do not take care of covering and labeling their projects may be charged for additional clay. Please do not bring additional supplies in unless you check with me first to make sure it is compatible with our studio.
